AFFORDABLE Government

- Pass the Parsippany Property Taxpayer Protection Act, a law that will forbid the municipal government from ever increasing the budget more than the rate of inflation unless the voters approve of it at the ballot box
- Lower your sewer and water fees-which increased more than 50% last year-by putting them on your property tax bill so you can deduct them off of your taxes
- Initiate various Process Improvement Audits, such as telephone and energy usage audits, to look for ways to save taxpayer dollars
- Offer services to neighboring towns as a way to share costs and generate revenue

RESPONSIVE Services

- Set up a Citizens Action Committee to review citizen complaints and ensure they are quickly resolved by the appropriate municipal department
- Create a Public Safety Task Force that will address safety issues and require the Parsippany Police Department to release an annual crime report
- Institute a Six Sigma process, a measure of quality that strives for perfection, to evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of Parsippany's municipal operations
- Plan more senior events and make available information to seniors on state, local and federal programs that benefit them

PRINCIPLED Leadership

- Having an affordable government that provides responsive services will take principled leadership; independent-minded leadership that cares about serving you, the only special interest I answer to.
