Parsippany's Sewer Fees Up 52%... In One Year!

As a Parsippany resident, you've probably noticed that your sewer bills have skyrocketed this year. What was once a fairly insignificant expense for the average homeowner has now become a major bill, with sewer fees more than doubling in one year.

Our Sewer Fees Have Become Just Another Example of Government That Costs Too Much. And inefficient, costly government is making it increasingly difficult for Parsippany's hard-working families to get by and maintain a high standard of living. Like school, county and municipal property taxes, not to mention states sales and income taxes, sewer fees are taking a bigger bite out of the family budget.

You Deserve To Keep More of Your Money, which is why we need to make government more affordable. So, in addition to the Parsippany Property Taxpayer Protection Act, which limits



municipal budget increases to the rate of inflation, if elected to the Town Council, I will also propose the Parsippany Sewer Fee Relief Act.

The Parsippany Sewer Fee Relief Act is simple. As a Parsippany homeowner, your sewer fees will be put on your property tax bill so you can deduct them off of your federal taxes. In the same way deducting property taxes helps you afford to pay that tax, you'll be able to do the same with your sewer fees, which are really just another tax. You'll still see how much you're paying in sewer fees because they'll be listed as a separate item on your tax bill, you just won't be flushing as much money down the drain.
